- Work equally hard for yourself and your team mates. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you
- Be a good sport, applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition
- Treat all participants in cricket as you like to be treated. DO not bully or take advantage of another competitor
- Cooperate with your team mates and opponents. Without them there is no competition
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents or coaches
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion
