What a cracking season! 12 keen and talented team members who I'm sure would have trained until dark if they were allowed. Stats were kept on who scored runs and who took wickets however we didn't really keep records on how many runouts were affected – and there were lots, almost all of which were direct hits! Sometimes I almost felt sorry for the opposition – surely 9 and 10yr olds shouldn't be able to do that!

It was great to watch the team grow over the 6 months. Caroline Thewlis and Declan Simmons channelled their inner Mitchell Starc – left arm bowlers - to lead the bowling statistically, Caroline having the best average, while Declan was second best and had the knack of taking wickets in groups having the two best figures in a match of 3 for 2 and 3 for 4 (generally each player bowls 2 overs each day). Zac Barden had the third best average, being quite accurate and giving away the equal least number of extras in the season (with Lachlan McPhie – 11 extras). In under 10s, sometimes hitting the pitch is a good effort, so to bowl so accurately – as many of the team did – was something to be applauded. A special mention also to Cruiz Barton who bowled with genuine pace – so much so that when I batted against him at training without pads, I really had to watch carefully! Definitely a talent to keep an eye on.

When it came to wielding the willow, Daksh Wagii and Gurtej Sambhy forged a formidable opening partnership as the season went on. You know the guys are cricket mad when Daksh comes to training and says, "I want to bat like Peter Hanscombe" and proceeds to imitate a very distinct style. Lachlan McPhie scored the most runs and most boundaries in regular Saturday cricket, while Yash Singh had the best average which is a great reward – I remember one match Yash coming off not happy that he hadn't scored too many runs, but at the end of the day he didn't get out either! Andrew Saab epitomised the "value your wicket" approach, only being dismissed twice in the season.

- Liam Sherry – firstly taking an amazing catch at training at deep fine leg- a ball that I managed to hit which surely came down with snow on it, and somehow, he held on; and secondly his Big Bash-esque batting at the gala day which I believe involved 3 sixes and 2 fours – it was thrilling!

What a memorable season for our Under 12 players, ending with our team winning the Grand Final in a nail-biting finish against Baulkham Hills!

Our players came together with diverse sporting backgrounds, personalities and developing skills, with some playing proper cricket for the first time. However, from the first game, we could see that this group of young boys began to accept, encourage and support each other. And so, this champion team began to play for each other.

Our boys listened to their coach's words of encouragement and followed his guidance both during their games and at training. The team manager provided timely detailed score updates on myCricket website.

Our players were well supported by their parents and loved ones who contributed to making the training sessions and game wins a huge success well beyond our initial expectations.

Here is a summary of the games:

Game 1 vs Kings Langley: What a start. We won (154 vs 102). Thomas' 26 runs and bowling effort of 2/11, and Armaan's 13 runs and bowling figure of 1/14 contributed to the win.

Game 2 vs Rouse Hills Rams: A one-day match. We won (9/97 vs 7/76). Thomas' 27 runs and 1/6, and Harrison's 3/7 were crucial for our win. We fielded very well against some feisty opposition supporters.

Game 3 vs Baulkham Hills Maroons: We won after starting nervously (9/72 and 8/95 vs 9/37), thanks to an outstanding first innings team bowling effort, with Harrison recording 3/7, supported by Armaan (2/5), Thomas (2/12) and Samuel (2/5); (Armaan's 25 runs and Cullen's 33 runs holding out in the second innings, sharing a match winning partnership of 74 runs for the third wicket).

Game 4 vs Auburn: We lost (96 vs 8/168). Our players certainly learned from this experience of playing in not so perfect weather and pitch conditions.

Game 5 vs Baulkham Hills: A one-day match. We won (5/75 vs 71) with the best bowling and fielding effort (restricting our extras to merely 14 runs). Cullen's 2/9 and Sam's 2/11 were outstanding. This was well supported by Armaan's 21 runs and Harrison's 18 runs, chasing down a small target.

Game 6 vs Parramatta WCC: We won (119 vs 65). Harrison's 34 runs, supported by Alexander (8 runs), anchored our innings (after the team score stood at 1 run for 4 wickets). Thomas' 3/13, Shreyas' 2/2, Ethan's 1/8 and Harrison's 1/6 contributed to the win.

Game 7 vs Wentworthville: We won a close game (119 vs 103). Ethan's 35 runs and Cullen's 10 runs helped build a reasonable target. Under pressure, our boys challenged themselves and restricted the opposition's run chase. Cullen took 4 catches. Outstanding bowling from Samuel (2/17), Michael Dennis (1/8), and Armaan (1/15) in contributing to the win.

Game 8 vs Kings Langley: All matches were cancelled on day-2 of the game due to extreme weather conditions albeit we did manage to bowl in one innings on day-1. (a draw).

Game 9 vs Rouse Hills Rams: We won (172 vs 8/91). This was our best batting effort. Alexander's patient 40 runs were well supported by Samuel (31 runs), Harrison (27 runs), Michael (11 runs) and Cullen (10 runs). Our bowlers stepped up with Shreyas' 2/3, Ethan's 1/4, Cullen's 1/6, Max's 1/9, Isaac's 1/1, restricting the opposition's run chase.

Game 10 vs Baulkham Hills Maroon: We won (9/79 vs 57). Armaan's 12 runs and Ethan's 20 runs helped build a decent target. Our bowling and fielding effort saved the day. Ethan got 2/5, supported by Samuel (2/6), Armaan (2/8), Michael (1/5).

Semi Final vs Wentworthville: a wash-out. We advanced to the Grand Final (by coming first in the competition in the preliminary matches)!

Grand Final vs Baulkham Hills: We won (9/118 vs 4/116) over two consecutive days. Our team's fighting spirit got us the win. Armaan's patient 21 runs, supported by Alexander's 8 runs, held our innings together. The players played for each other. Max selflessly offered to be the 12th man. It was simply an admirable act. Max deserved this win as much as his team mates. The last partnership of Shreyas and Brody arguably demonstrated how these young boys have grown and developed throughout the competition. It was so fitting that Brody scored the winning run. The game was a wonderful display of courage, determination and team spirit by our players, backed by amazing support from families and friends on the boundary.

We are sure this experience will immensely help our boys in other aspects of successful life, including team dynamics, goal setting and devising winning game plans against opposition within the spirit of rules and regulations in a fun, positive and competitive environment.


