**Hasandu De Silva** - Hasandu receives the top run scorer and wicket taker awards. He is an exceptional cricketer and his all-round skill was a real highlight for us all to see on a weekly basis. His drives down the ground were the feature of his batting. His bowling pace at u/10 age is quite unbelievable and he will continue to grow as a strike bowler.

**Aadesh Balendra** – Aadesh delivered with both bat and ball every Saturday and is also capable of taking multiple wickets with his fast bowling. Add to that numerous direct hit run outs which sees him win the most deserving award. Aadesh also bowls a great line and length at pace and is another strike bowler in the making. **David Vo** – David is a natural leader who often lifted the side when they were quiet in the field. His ability to cover numerous fielding positions along with his walking in with the bowler wins him the fielding award. Another highlight of David's season was his running between the wickets, especially when batting with the less experienced players. These structured and formal training sessions with Andrew and the boys lifted the confidence level of the boys to a great extent.

As we progressed our bowling became our strength which was appreciated by opposition teams.

From a team performance perspective Jake Piper, Jonathan Tuscano and Pradyut Thaivalappil were our most consistent batters while Nuh Arsalan, Anush Gupta, Parthiv Thaivalappil, Elijah Eglingotn, Aarav Jadhav and Ethan Dsouza provided the much needed support while batting at different batting positions during the competition.

From a bowling perspective Pradyut Thaivalappil, Jake Piper and Anush Gupta were our most consistent bowlers with the rest of the team also picking up wickets across matches.


