## SENIOR CODE OF BEHAVIOUR





The Greystanes Cricket Club is a small community based cricket club that has been playing in the PDCA since 1971. The club relies on committed volunteer administrators, coaches, parents and players to make our club a success.

Cricket is an exciting game that encourages leadership, friendship and teamwork, which brings together people from different nationalities, cultures and religions, especially when played with the Spirit of Cricket.

Whilst cricket can be competitive, it is important to play within the spirit of the game. Mutual respect, fairness, positiveness, self-discipline and appreciation are some of the key behaviours our club consider extremely important.

It is important that all participants (whether a volunteer administrator, coach, parent, or player) familiarise themselves with the Cricket Australia Code of Conduct, that our club fully embraces.

## Players Code of Behaviour

- Play by the rules;
- Never argue with an umpire. If you disagree, have your captain, approach the umpire in an appropriate manner during a break or after the game;
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in cricket;
- Work equally hard for yourself and your teammates. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you;
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition;
- Treat all participants in cricket as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor;
- Cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition;
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents, or coaches;
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Always encourage your team mates to be the best they can be.
