The past season held some challenges for our under 12 two's side. The first was to not just maintain, but to build on the skills learnt the previous season. They would duly break off into groups when asked, to complete the afternoons drill activities, with a minimum of fuss, and then participate as if in a game situation. It was pleasing to see that every boy had made improvements on each of the three disciplines. Results like these do not come easily. Only with the determination of the individual to the best that he can do, by looking, listening, practicing.

Anyone who has coached a team knows how difficult it can be to organize 11 or more young boys. I thank all the parents who gave of their time during the season to assist me in this pursuit. Also, I would like to especially thank Terry Hoban, who unselfishly volunteered to assist me with coaching the boys at the beginning of the season. He often held practice sessions unassisted, due to my work constraints. His input has been invaluable and the respect the boys have for him is a testimony to his efforts.

As a coach, it is pleasing to reflect on the past season. To see all our boys with smiling faces at training or at the game. To see them applaud and congratulate opposition players on a good effort, 'unprompted', shows my time spent with them has not been in vein. Good sportsmanship must be fostered.

I look forward to doing it all over again.

This was always going to be a season for rebuilding after we lost six players from last season's combination. Two received promotion to Terry's team, two joined their high school friends at another club and the other two were lost to cricket. Yet the most critical blow was experienced after two games when we lost our star player of the last two seasons, Louie Matri (227 runs and 24 wickets in seasons 2006-2007) for the rest of the season to a serious knee injury. Still, out of adversity arises opportunity and several players new to cricket made their mark this season whilst a couple of our continuing players lifted their game to a higher dimension.

Due to byes and rain, we played just fifteen days cricket in season 2007-08 and were one player short on five occasions. After the weather cost us our first two victory opportunities in rounds 4 and 6, we eventually broke through in round 7 only to face our second bye immediately after. Injuries, sicknesses and other absence meant that we were not able to field a full-strength combination in the post-Christmas period and our performances fell away towards the end of the season.

JASON DAABOUL - This newcomer to cricket had a highly promising first season. His greatest contribution to the team came from his highly accurate off-spin bowling which included a spell of 5-6 against Baulkham Hills in Round 6. He also showed tremendous skill as an occasional wicketkeeper. He is a potentially explosive batsman who often batted without much luck this season.

FABREECE FERNANDEZ - A newcomer to our team, he showed himself to be a highly promising leg spin bowler who suffered the most from the team's fielding lapses with seven catches dropped from his bowling. He has ability with the bat but needs to work on his defensive technique in the upcoming season.

COREY FOXX - A newcomer to our club, he proved himself to be easily our best batsman technically and in terms of consistency. He saved us from outright defeat in round 3 against Wenty Leagues and steered us to our only victory in round 7 against Kings Langley. Although he struggled as a bowler, he always fielded with energy and finished with most catches.

WADE HARTLAND - Another newcomer to cricket who had a highly promising first season. As a batsman, he occupied the crease for long periods proving very difficult to dislodge. Yet it was his bowling that was most important to the team as he took over from the injured Louie as the opening support for James and regularly contributed an early wicket or two. He was also a good close fielder.

JOEL LENDVAI - He developed as a cricketer in both batting and fielding this season. He shared the highest partnership for any wicket this season in round 2 against Guildford Leagues and contributed a critical innings in round 6 against Baulkham Hills. He also proved to be a reliable and sharp fielder at cover and mid-off.

BRENT McRAE - Another newcomer to cricket, he played just four days in the season. He achieved the best bowling strike rate with 2 wickets from 28 balls. He contributed a catch and a wicket in our only victory.

JOHN MATRI - He had a brilliant start to the season, contributing 101 runs in our first three games including the highest score of the season, 48 against Guildford Leagues in round 2.
