With most of the team having played modified cricket the previous year, we were under no illusion as to the difficulty of skipping a whole age group in moving straight to Under 12s in 2006-2007. Our final results of three wins and eight losses seems to bear this out and yet, it was very nearly so much different. We were 2-59 chasing 72 for outright victory when time elapsed against AKA Sports, the eventual champions in Round 7 and were dismissed for 117 chasing 128 for victory against the runners-up, Baulkham Hills in the penultimate round. Had we won these games, we would have made the semi-finals.

Certainly, we played our best cricket after Christmas, when we managed to make at least 100 runs in every first innings. Before Christmas, we only achieved this once, when we defeated Pendle Hill in round 4. Our bowling on the other hand kept us competitive for long periods as we rarely failed to take early wickets. Unfortunately, our support bowlers weren't able to maintain the pressure when the main bowlers were being rested. Thus 4-6 became 121 all out in round 3, 7-40 became 155 all out in round 5 and 6-25 became 77 all out in round 7. Therefore this is an obvious area for improvement along with improving our fitness levels for those long hot sessions in the field.

SIDNEY BAROI – Returned to the fold after a season off and nearly always made a start as a regular opening bat. He was a strong cutter and hooker of the ball who shared in our best partnerships for the first four wickets. His medium pace bowling was usually accurate but not always penetrative.

JACOB BASKERVILLE – After struggling for runs in the first five rounds, he top scored with 26 against Kellyville in Round 6. At his best, he is a good driver and cutter of the ball. He is an occasional spinner who needs to work on his accuracy.

JOSH DENINA – A newcomer to cricket who showed great promise at times with the bat. He has an excellent eye but needs to work on his footwork in the coming season. He is a reliable and tidy keeper and an unlucky left arm spin bowler who had five catches dropped from his bowling.

CONOR DEWAR – Had a stunning debut season with a number of highlights. He announced his arrival with 5 catches in an innings in Round 2 against AKA Sports, and also top scored in the second innings. Although the runs dried up after that for a while, he finished the season strongly, top scoring in our last two matches. He also proved to be a surprisingly nippy change bowler and a highly competent keeper.

JOEL LENDVAI – Although runs didn't always flow, he valued his wicket more than most. His dogged determination helped to save us from outright defeat in round 6 against Kellyville. He always tried hard in the field and developed promisingly as a support keeper. PATRICK LOGARAJ – The third of our newcomers, he became a frontline bowler of fast-medium in-swing. His value to the team became most apparent when a mid-season form slump coincided with the highest scores we conceded in the season. Our results improved when his rhythm returned in the last three games. Initially, a swashbuckling batsman, he developed an ability to build an innings in the post-Christmas matches.

JOHN MATRI – Although the youngest in the team, he was one of the first to show the ability to regularly build an innings. When he lost form with the bat mid-season, his slow-medium off-spin bowling clicked into gear. He invariably made a breakthrough or slowed the momentum of the opposition with this tight bowling. He proved to be a good close-in fielder with a sharp pair of hands.

LOUIE MATRI – He again won the team's Player of the Season award with an excellent haul of 227 and 24 wickets. He contributed most as a fast-medium opening bowler in the first three games including a haul of 6-10 in round 3 against Kings Langley. From rounds 5 to 9, it was his batting that was supreme, culminating with 35no in 40 minutes to secure an outright win in round 9 against Pendle Hill. In addition, his fielding was always of the highest standard.

JAMES REVAl – He proved to be the second best all-rounder in the side. Our fine finish to the season was in no small measure due to his improvement with the bat as he shared the highest partnerships for the 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> wickets in the post-Christmas period. Although his bowling was sometimes inconsistent, he destroyed the top order of Baulkham Hills in round 5 with 4-7, and secured our victory in round 11 against Kellyville with 3-3 from 7 overs. CHRIS SILCOCK – He struggled with inconsistency during his second season. He occupied the crease for long periods on a number of occasions playing particularly well against both Kings Langley and the eventual champions AKA Sports. However, on some other occasions he was too impatient and threw away his innings. He showed occasional brilliance in the field but often lacked accuracy with the ball.

JARRYD SMART – His bowling was of great value to the team as he contributed important wickets in each of our three victories. However, he had a lean season with the bat, seldom occupying the crease for sufficient time to build an innings.

LIAM TANIANE – After playing two long patient innings in rounds 1 and 3, he reinvented himself as somewhat of a dasher in the second part of the season. He demonstrated the ability to play genuinely fast bowling on a number of occasions.

PATRICK THORNCRAFT – Although he always tried hard, he struggled to re-discover the batting form he displayed in his debut season. He had few opportunities to shine as a bowler but was always a capable outfielder with an excellent arm.

The assistant coaches and I would like to thank all our players for the commitment, enthusiasm and sportsmanship that they demonstrated throughout the year. We would also like to thank Attila Lendvai for his match reports and for his efforts as chief scorer and Judy Smart who stood in for him on a number of Saturdays. Thanks also to all the parents for their support of the team and the efforts of the coaches. Finally, I would like to acknowledge Brian and John who so ably assisted me at training each week and thank Brian again for looking after the team when I was away at weddings in Perth.
