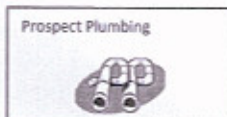

A Memorable Learning experience for our Future Community Members

Having won the previous year's tournament, our players and supporting parents had naturally high expectations of another possible Grand Final appearance competing against other clubs of similar age and skill set in Junior Cricket. We started the Season with a comfortable win in the two-day game format against Baulkham Hills Maroons followed by a closely contested loss in a one-day match against Wentworthville and another two-day game Win against Parramatta. At the start of Match 4 our players had begun to sense the need to lift their game as majority of contestants were beginning to demonstrate higher level of cricketing skills. Matches 4 and 5 against Baulkham Hills Gold and Baulkham Hills Blue teams resulted in our first set of back-to-back team losses. Match 6, against this year's finalist Kings Langley, saw us deliver the best performance of the season leading to a well-deserved win with some terrific individual performances and team work. The result for Match 7 against Rouse Hill, being the final match of 2017 just before long a six-week break, came as a big surprise. We simply could not defend a big team total, driven by some missed catches and fielding errors combined with one of the opposition player scoring a patient century, which happened to be the first over-fifty runs scored against our bowling in fifteen matches spread across two seasons.

Match 8 against Baulkham Hills Maroon (a one-day match) and Match 9 against Wentworthville Leagues at the start of 2018 were lost, partly driven by inadequate preparation and a few debatable Leg Before Wicket umpiring decisions against our high scoring batters from previous matches. Match 10 saw us put up a vastly improved performance in an evenly contested game against Paramatta which was lost in the penultimate over ending our hopes of making it to the top-4 teams of the tournament this season.

Match 11 was a one-day game against Baulkham Hills Gold which was played in true sporting spirit as three of the team players could not turn up driven by personal commitments. Despite the anticipated team loss, our players thoroughly enjoyed the last match of the season with a forward-looking mindset to come back and commence a new season with invaluable experience of working in teams gained in the cricket field.

In terms of team Statistics, we finished at Position 4 with a team quotient of 0.9571 in 11 games out of the total of 8 competing teams with the highest quotient of 1.3352 achieved by a team which we were able to beat. All our players contributed to team goals to the best of their abilities and despite a mixed bag of success driven by uncontrollable factors on few occasions, we learned that by maintaining a high standard of sporting spirit, discipline, focus, enthusiasm and by supporting each other, we can easily repeat our competition winning abilities in the future as already done in the previous season. 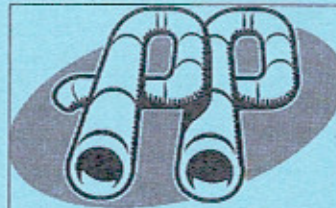
